High Noon, Saturday, May 2, Three Oaks Township Library, 3 North Elm Street

"The Browns, Eddie Gaedel, and a Glove" features an overview of the Museum itself; and introduces baseball's forgotten team, the St. Louis Browns, which includes the story of baseball's only batter with a 100% on base percentage (the Browns' Eddie Gaedel); and a wonderful story about a special 75-year-old baseball mitt.

Presented by the staff of the Biggest Little Baseball Museum.

High Noon, Saturday June 6, Three Oaks Township Library, 3 North Elm Street

"The Bird: Mark Fidrych and the Summer of 1976". 2026 marks the 50th anniversary of when Mark Fidrych took Detroit – and America by storm with his incredible pitching and eccentric behavior. Learn and reminisce about that crazy summer with guest presenter Brian Johnston. *Brian Johnston lives in St. Joseph, Michigan with his family. He is the author of three self-published books and is an Opinion Maker columnist for the Herald Palladium. His recent biography of baseball great Vada Pinson will be available this summer.*

High Noon, Saturday July 4, Three Oaks Masonic Lodge, 14 ½ North Elm Street, above ~~Alapash~~ (A great opportunity to visit this historic Lodge, established in 1867).

"The Shot Heard 'Round the World" will enlighten and entertain attendees about one of the greatest stories in baseball history that took place in the 1951 season. Learn about the "Miracle at Coogan's Bluff" and be reminded about the beauty of our National Pastime.

Presented by the staff of the Biggest Little Baseball Museum.

High Noon, Saturday August 1, Vickers Theatre, 6 North Elm Street.

"Return of the Clowns: Barnstorming Baseball Then and Now". Three Oaks' born Bill Heward is in a special position to share about the Indianapolis Clowns. The lanky right hander pitched for the Clowns in their final years, and wrote "Some are Called Clowns", describing his experience. That was over 50 years ago. The Clowns have been reborn and are one of six teams competing in the new Banana Ball Championship League. During this season's spring training, Jesse Cole of the Savannah Bananas sought out Bill to share about the history of the Clowns. Bill spent quality time with the team, letting them know of the opportunity they have to continue the legacy of the Clowns. Come and enjoy this special presentation. *Dr. Heward is a Professor Emeritus in the College of Education and Human Ecology at Ohio State University. He was a member of River Valley's first high school baseball team, threw a no hitter in RV's opener and went on to pitch at Western Michigan University. His grandfather Ollie umpired many games for the Three Oaks Greens.*

Admission is free, and includes a complimentary box of Cracker Jacks. The Biggest Little Baseball Museum is a 501c3, and accepts donations of cash, new and used baseball books, as well as used baseballs and softballs. The Biggest Little Baseball Museum is in the middle of Three Oaks Magnificent Quarter Mile, in a room on the second floor of the historic Three Oaks Township Library.

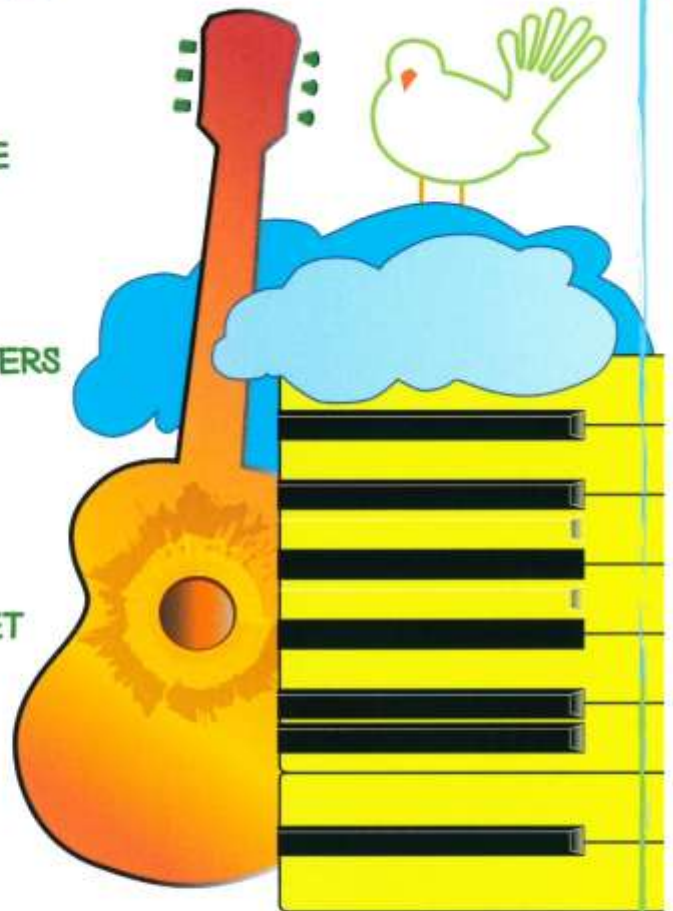

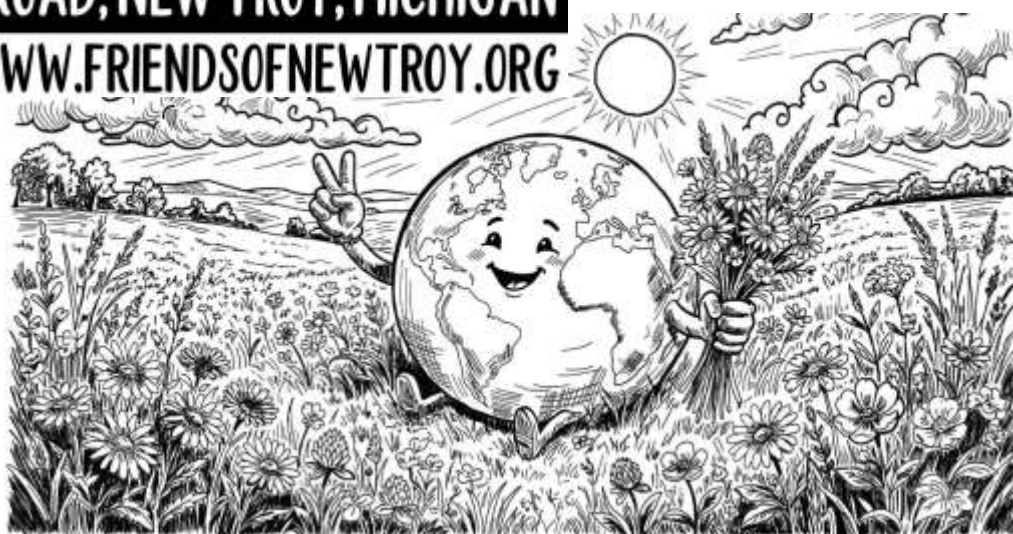
