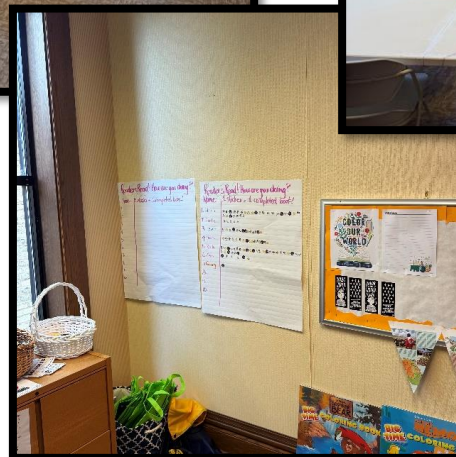


Summer Reading for children ends

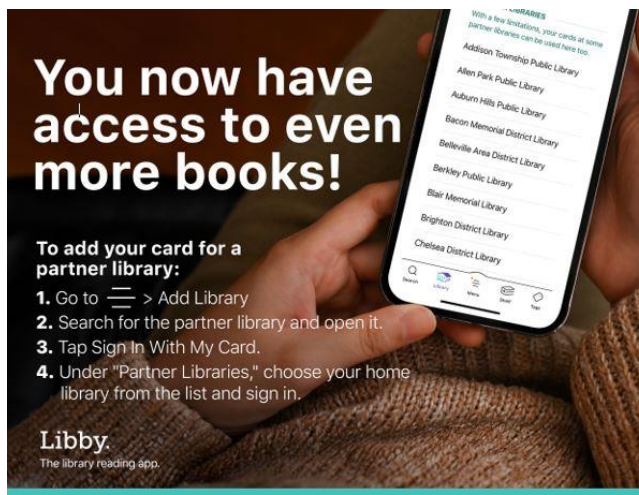

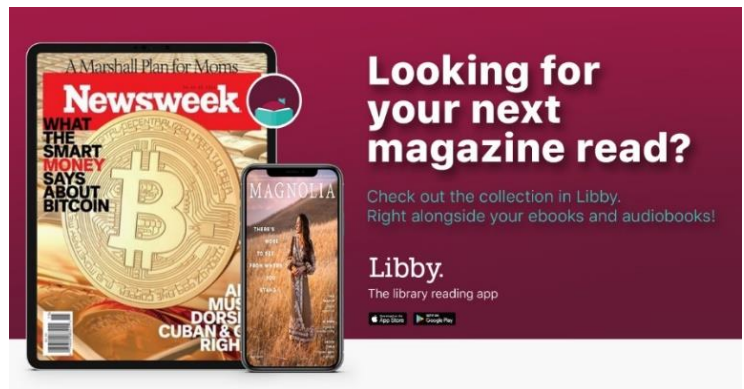

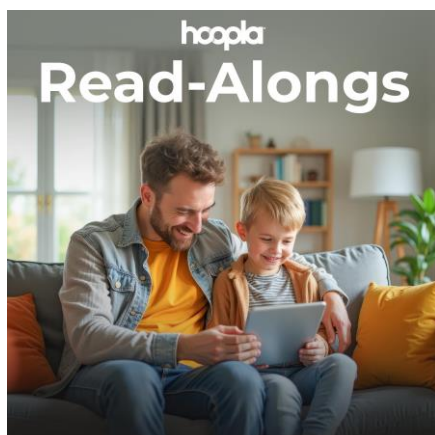
